Waldo, shall be one hundred and fifty dollars, and that of the Register of Probate, in the same county, shall be two hundred and fifty dollars, per annum, to commence on the fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and to be paid to each of said officers thereafter from the county treasury, in the manner prescribed by the "Act establishing Salaries for Judges and Registers of Probate," passed March seventh, eighteen hundred and twenty-six.

CHAPTER CCCLXXIV.

AN ACT to alter the time of holding the Court of Sessions in the County of Hancock.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the term of the Court of Sessions, for the county of Hancock, which is now by law to be holden on the Thursday previous to the third Tuesday of November annually, shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be holden on the Thursday following the third Tuesday of October annually.

CHAPTER CCCLXXV.

AN additional ACT to provide for the Education of Youth.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Inhabitants of the town of Bath, at their annual town meetings, shall be, and hereby are authorized to choose school committees of such number as they may think proper, for the several school districts in said town, and the said committee shall have all the rights and powers,*
