ATTACHMENT.-SALARIES,

CHAPTER CCCXCIV.

AN additional ACT to exempt certain goods and chattels from attachment, execution and distress,

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That all potatoes raised or purchased by any person for Potatoes exemptthe consumption of himself and family, shall be exempt from attachment, execution and distress.

CHAPTER CCCXCV.

AN additional ACT respecting Salaries of Judges and Registers of Probate.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the salary of the Judge of Probate for the county Salary of Judge of Washington, shall be two hundred dollars, in created lieu of the salary now established by law, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the salary of the Register of Probate for the county of in Cumberland in-Cumberland, shall be eleven hundred dollars, instead of the salary now established by law, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight.
