CHAPTER CCCXCIV.

AN additional ACT to exempt certain goods and chattels from attach-
ment, execution and distress.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Rep-
resentatives, in Legislature assembled*, That all
potatoes raised or purchased by any person for Potatoes exempt-
ed.
the consumption of himself and family, shall be
exempt from attachment, execution and distress.

CHAPTER CCCXCV.

AN additional ACT respecting Salaries of Judges and Registers of Probate.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House
of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That
the salary of the Judge of Probate for the county Salary of Judge
in Washington in-
creased.
of Washington, shall be two hundred dollars, in
lieu of the salary now established by law, com-
mencing on the first day of January, one thousand
eight hundred and twenty eight.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That the salary
of the Register of Probate for the county of _____ of Register
in Cumberland in-
creased.
Cumberland, shall be eleven hundred dollars,
instead of the salary now established by law,
commencing on the first day of January, one thou-
sand eight hundred and twenty eight.
