CHAPTER DIV.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of Commercial Hall.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That John L. Megquier, Francis O. J. Smith, Luther Jewett, George Willis, James C. Churchill, John Mahan, Charles Q. Clapp, William A. H. Clapp, William J. Quincy, Solomon H. Mudge, Thomas Todd, Jeremiah Haskell, Elijah E. Hanson, Caleb S. Carter, Thomas O. Bradley, Stephen Morton, John W. Smith, William T. Vaughan, and Nathaniel Shaw, Jr., their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are, incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Proprietors of Commercial Hall; with power to prosecute and defend suits at law, to have a common seal, and to change the same; to make and put into execution any by-laws, for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State; to take and hold for the objects of said Corporation, any real and personal estate to the value of twenty thousand dollars; to give, grant, bargain and sell the same, with all such privileges, immunities and powers as are incident to Corporations instituted for literary and scientific purposes.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said Corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner as a majority of the five persons first herein named, shall direct.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this Act may be enlarged, restrained or annulled at the pleasure of the Legislature.
