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shall remain in the Treasury of said company, subject to the payment of such losses and expenses as have or may thereafter accrue; and the balance, if any remain, shall be returned to the party from whom it was collected, on demand, after thirty days from the expiration of the term for which insurance was made.

SECT. 9. Be it further enacted, That the said company may make insurance, for any term, Description of not exceeding seven years, on dwelling houses, property on which insurance may be stores, shops, and other buildings, household fur-made, &c. niture, and merchandize, in this State, against loss or damage by fire, originating in any cause, other than by design in the assured. And that when Provision in case the property insured shall be alienated by sale, or of the sale of property, &c. otherwise, the policy shall thereupon be void, and be surrendered to the Directors of said company, to be cancelled; and upon such surrender, the assured shall be entitled to receive his, her or their deposite note or notes, upon the payment of his, her or their proportion of all losses and expenses that have accrued prior to such surrender.

SECT. 10. Be it further enacted, That any First meeting, how two of the persons herein named, are authorized and when called. to call the first meeting, by posting up advertisements, in two or more public places in Gorham, ten days prior to said meeting.
