SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

First meeting how called &c.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this act may be enlarged, restrained or repealed, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

Powers restricted.

CHAPTER DXXV.

AN ACT repealing the second section of An Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Maine Historical Society," passed February fifth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, [two,] and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the second section of the act aforesaid, to which this is in addition, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Second section of former Act repealed.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the said Maine Historical Society be, and hereby are, authorized to hold their annual, and other meetings, at such times and places, as they may think proper.

Times and places of holding annual and other meetings.

CHAPTER DXXVI.

AN ACT additional to An Act relating to Fish in East Machias waters.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That if the owners or occupants of any dam, where a fish-way is required by the fifth section of the Act aforesaid, shall neglect or refuse to make and keep open such fish-way, as many days

In case owners or occupants of dams neglect to erect and keep open fish ways, the same may be erected at the expense of such owner or occupant.
