in each year as the Fish Committee may judge necessary, after ten days notice given in writing by said committee, they are authorized and empowered to build and keep open such fish-way, and to recover of such owner or occupant in an action on the case, the necessary expenses of building and keeping open such fish-way.

Committee liable to penalty.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted*, That if said committee shall neglect to carry into effect the provisions of this Act, and the Act to which this is additional, they shall forfeit and pay a sum not less than twenty nor more than fifty dollars, to be recovered in an action on the case to use of said town.

Towns and plantations may dispose of the privilege of taking fish.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted*, That the inhabitants of every town and plantation, through which said river runs, are authorized to dispose of the privilege of taking fish within the limits of such town or plantation, at the annual meeting of such town or plantation.

Committee authorized to carry into effect this and former Act in any unincorporated lands

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted*, That said committee shall have the same powers to carry into effect the provisions of this Act, and the Act to which this is additional, in any unincorporated lands situated on said river, as they possess in their own towns and plantations.

Provisions of former Act repealed.

SECT. 5. *Be it further enacted*, That the several provisions of an Act, inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER DXXVII.

AN ACT additional to "An Act to incorporate the Portland Stage Company."

May hold estate to the amount of \$50,000 instead of \$40,000.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That, from and after the passing of this Act, the Proprietors of the Portland Stage Company, may take and hold any real or personal estate, to the

amount of fifty thousand dollars, instead of forty thousand dollars, as provided by the Act to which this is additional.

CHAPTER DXXVIII.

AN ACT to cede to the United States the jurisdiction of certain tracts of land.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That there be, and hereby is ceded to the United States of America, the jurisdiction of the several tracts of land, in Saco and Biddeford, in the county of York, hereinafter described, to wit: First, beginning on Gordon's Lower Point, so called, at the bank of Saco River at high water mark, and at the termination of the Arm of the Pier, thence running north twenty-five degrees west by the Pier one hundred and forty feet to the channel of the river; thence east ten degrees north seventy-five feet by said Pier; thence south forty-five degrees east one hundred and seventy feet to the bank of said River at high water mark; thence westerly by said bank to the first bound. Second, beginning at Gordon's upper point, so called, in Biddeford, at the bank of the Saco river at high water mark, and at the termination of the Arm of the Pier, thence running north forty degrees east by the front of the Pier ninety-five feet; thence south sixty degrees east by the said Pier sixty-five feet; thence south twenty-five feet to a high rock; thence southwesterly to the first bound. Third, beginning on Lassell's Point, so called, in Biddeford, at the bank of Saco River, at high water mark, thence running east by south nineteen feet; thence east south-east thirty-three feet; thence southeast half south forty-five feet; thence south southwest twenty-three feet; thence south-
