Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as a majority of the persons named in this Act shall direct.

CHAPTER DXXXV.

AN ACT to incorporate the Mosaic Lodge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and

Persons incorporated.

Powers, &c

May hold estate.

House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That William Frost, Moses L. Hobbs, Joseph Kelsey, James S. Holmes, and Solomon Cushman, their associates and successors, be, and

they hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of "Mosaic Lodge;" and by that name may prosecute and defend suits

at law; with power to have and use a common seal; to make and establish any by-laws, for the convenient management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this State; to take and hold

for charitable and benevolent purposes, any real and personal estate to the value of five thousand dollars; and to give, grant, bargain or sell the same; and with all other powers and privileges usually granted to other societies instituted for

purposes of charity and beneficence.

First meeting how called.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said corporation shall be held at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as a majority of the persons named in this

Act shall direct.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers restricted, granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restricted, or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

CHAPTER DXXXVI.

AN ACT to incorporate the Athenæan Society of Bowdoin College.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Edward E. Bourne, James L. Child, Petsons incorpor-James M'Keen, Robert Orr, William P. Fessenden, Patrick H. Greenleaf, their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are, incorporated into a body politic, by the name of the Athenæan Society of Bowdoin College; and by that name Powers &c., may sue, prosecute and defend; have a common seal and change the same at pleasure; and make any by laws for its government, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of the State; hold and May hold estate, possess any estate, real and personal, to any amount, not exceeding five thousand dollars over and above the value of their books, and may sell and convey or lease the same.

SECT. Ž. Be it further enacted, That all the All the estate of estate of said corporation shall be held and used the corporation to exclusively for the encouragement of literature sections and the diffusion of science and useful knowledge.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers Powers restricted. granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restricted or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That the first resting by meeting for the organization of said corporation, whom and hew may be notified and held at such time and place as the said Robert Orr may direct.
