CHAPTER DXXXIX.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Chandlerville.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the plantation numbered Five, in the second range, north of the Waldo patent, in the county of Somerset, bounded as follows, to wit: beginning at the northwest corner of said plantation and at the south line of Palmyra; thence running east to Plymouth, and to the county line, between the counties of Somerset and Penobscot; thence south, on said Plymouth, to the first range of townships north of the Waldo patent; thence west, on said range line, to Burnham; thence northerly, on said Burnham, to the Sebacook river; thence, by the east line of Pittsfield, to the south line of Palmyra, the first mentioned bounds; be, and the same hereby is incorporated into a town by the name of Chandlerville; and the inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, which the inhabitants of other towns within this State do, or may, by law, enjoy.

Boundaries.

Provision for the choice of Representatives.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the said town of Chandlerville shall be entitled to vote for the choice of a Representative in the Legislature of this State, in the same class as before the passage of this Act.
