CHAPTER DLVI.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Wellington.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the Plantation number Three, in the first range of Townships on the Bingham Purchase, on the east side of Kennebec River, now called Bridgestown, with the inhabitants thereon, be, and they hereby are incorporated into a town, by the name of Wellington. And the inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, which the inhabitants of towns within this State do or may by law enjoy,

Territory incorporated.

Powers.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the sum of fourteen thousand dollars shall be taken from the State valuation of Bingham's Purchase, in said county of Somerset, and set to said town of Wellington.

Part of valuation of Bingham's purchase set to Wellington.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That said town of Wellington shall be entitled to vote for the choice of Representatives to the Legislature of this State, in the same class of which Cornville forms a part, and shall continue a part of the class aforesaid, until otherwise provided by law.

Provision for the choice of Representative.

CHAPTER DLVII.

AN Additional ACT to prevent the destruction of Fish in Denny's River and Pinnaquan.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the powers given to the Fish Committee, chosen in the towns of Charlotte, Baring, Cooper, and Plantation number Fourteen, in an Act to which this is in addition, passed February seventh, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-

Powers of fish committee of certain towns, extended to others, &c.
