Twitchell, junior, James Twitchell, John E. Twitchell, Mark Twitchell, Dorcas Twitchell, Sally Twitchell, Susan Twitchell, Betsey Twitchell, Eliza Twitchell, Clarisa Twitchell, Lydia Twitchell, Cynthia Twitchell, and Rachel Twitchell, all of New Portland, in the county of Somerset, to be severally allowed to lay aside the surname of Twitchell, and to take the surname of Mitchell. And said persons shall in future, be respectively known and called by the names which they are respectively allowed to take as aforesaid; and the same shall be considered as their only proper names.

CHAPTER DLXVII.

AN ACT additional to An Act to establish the Kennebec and Androscoggin Canal Association.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the corporation established by the Act, to which this is additional, be, and hereby are authorized to erect, keep and maintain the dam required to be maintained by the second section of said Act, across Dead River at any suitable and convenient place across the same, other than at the mouth thereof: *Provided,* That said dam shall be erected between the Androscoggin River and the junction of said Canal with the said Androscoggin Pond.

Part of former Act modified.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the said corporation be and hereby are authorized to make said Canal from the Cobbossee Contee Ponds to the Androscoggin River, by any other route, and in any other direction, than the great Androscoggin Pond and Dead River, that upon a survey of the same, shall be judged most practicable; subject to the same liabilities, as is provided in the Act to which this is additional.

Further modified.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That at any time, within six years from the passage of said Act, the Legislature may take said Canals as provided in the fifteenth section of said Act, and not afterwards.

Legislature may take the Canals within a certain time and not afterwards.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That so much of the second section of said Act as requires the dam to be kept and maintained across the mouth of Dead River, and so much of the fifteenth section as is inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be, and hereby are repealed.

Parts of former Act repealed.

CHAPTER DLXVIII.

AN ACT to apportion and assess on the Inhabitants of this State a Tax of forty-nine thousand, nine hundred and eighty-eight dollars.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That each town, plantation, or other place herein after named, within this State, shall be assessed and pay the several sums with which they respectively stand charged, viz :
