CHAPTER XIV.

Resolve in favor of the Massachusetts Medical Society.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty-one dollars and ninety-two cents be refunded and paid to the Treasurer of the Massachusetts Medical Society for taxes and expenses paid on township numbered nine, in the ninth range north of the Waldo Patent, for the years eighteen hundred twenty-one, eighteen hundred twenty-two, and eighteen hundred twenty-three, during which time said land belonged to said Massachusetts Medical Society, and was not liable to be taxed.

CHAPTER XV.

Resolve in favor of certain Chiefs of the Penobscot Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid out of any monies now in the Treasury, belonging to said Tribe, a sum not exceeding one hundred and twelve dollars, to John Etienne, Francis Loran, and Pierre Mohawk, now on a visit to the seat of Government.

CHAPTER XVI.

An additional Resolve for opening and clearing a road from the south line of township number Two, old Indian Purchase, on the east side of Penobscot river to Metanawcook Stream.

Resolved, That the Governor, with advice of Council, be, and he is hereby authorized to appoint an agent, whose duty it shall be, under the direction of the Governor, to make and complete the road leading from the south line of township number Two, old Indian Purchase, on the east side of Penobscot River to Metanawcook stream, (excepting so much as is upon General Treat's tract,) where the same has been opened and partly made, unless said agent shall find some alterations therein necessary; and in that case, the agent is authorized to make the road where it will best accommodate the public: *Provided*, That no greater sum be expended thereon than is hereby appropriated.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars be, and hereby is appropriated to satisfy the claim of Joshua Carpenter for labor and expenditures already bestowed by him

upon said road, and to enable the agent who may be appointed under this Resolve to make and complete said road; said sum of three thousand dollars to be collected from demands now due, or becoming due, to the State for lands sold, or which may be sold in the townships through which said road passes. And the Land Agent is authorized and directed to allow and pay to said Joshua Carpenter, the sum of one thousand and forty three dollars and ninety-three cents, in any demands now due, or becoming due to the State, as aforesaid, in full satisfaction of said Carpenter's claim against the State for services and expenditures upon the road aforesaid.

Resolved, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorized to adjust and settle the accounts of the agent to be appointed under this Resolve, and to certify to the Land Agent the sum or sums that may be found due to the agent so to be appointed, or those employed by him, within the appropriation herein made, whereupon the Land Agent shall be authorized to pay the same from any collections to be made from the demands for lands sold, or to be sold, in the townships through which said road passes or by transferring any of said demands to the party entitled, without recourse to the State.

CHAPTER XVII.

Resolve in favor of the town of Whiting.

Resolved, That the State Treasurer be, and he hereby is, authorized to pay the town of Whiting twelve dollars and five cents; said town having been over rated that sum in the State Tax for the years one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one, to the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, inclusive; on account of land which is, and ever has been the property of this State.

Resolved, That one thousand and thirty four dollars be deducted from the State valuation, set to the town of Whiting, and that future taxes, on said town, be assessed accordingly.

Resolved, That the Court of Sessions within and for the county of Washington, be and they hereby are, authorized to make such abatement of the County taxes to the town of Whiting for the years aforesaid, as to said Court may appear just and reasonable.
