CHAPTER XXXVI.

Resolve in favor of Caleb Jewett and others.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State, the sum of one hundred and sixty two dollars and thirty three cents, to Caleb Jewett and others, the Committee who located the Canada road through Bingham's purchase, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, or their legal representatives, in full satisfaction for all claim on this State for said services and expenses: *Provided*, That the said Jewett and others shall not have any claim on Massachusetts, hereafter, for one third of the amount of their whole claim on said Commonwealth.

CHAPTER XXXVII.

Resolve making appropriation for expenses of the State Arsenal.

Resolved, That, for the preservation and safe keeping of the public property in the State Arsenal, or elsewhere, there be, and hereby is, appropriated, annually, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, to be expended in such manner as may be directed by the Governor, with advice of Council.

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

Resolve laying a tax on the several Counties in this State.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the several counties, contained in the following schedule, be, and the same are here-

by granted as a tax for each county respectively, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and for other purposes ordered by law.

YORK,	Seven thousand dollars.
CUMBERLAND,	Twelve thousand dollars.
LINCOLN,	Eight thousand dollars.
KENNEBEC,	Six thousand dollars.
HANCOCK,	Three thousand and three hundred dollars.
WASHINGTON,	Four thousand two hundred and eighty five dollars.
OXFORD,	Four thousand and five hundred dollars.
SOMERSET,	Three thousand dollars.
PENOBSCOT,	Six thousand dollars.
WALDO,	Four thousand and five hundred dollars.

CHAPTER XXXIX.

Resolve in favor of John G. Deane.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury to John G. Deane, the sum of one hundred dollars, for his services and expenses, (previous to the present session of the Legislature,) in obtaining necessary and useful information relative to the Northeastern Boundary, for the use and benefit of the State.

CHAPTER XL.

Resolve in favor of Daniel Rose.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Daniel Rose, the sum of two hundred dollars, in addition to his salary, in full for his services for the year ending the first day of January last past.

CHAPTER XLI.

Resolve in favor of Joel Wellington.

Resolved, That the Governor, with advice of Council, be authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer, for the sum of four hundred and ninety three dollars and thirty two cents, being the balance found due to said Wellington for his services and expenses for locating a road from Metauawcook to Houlton.
