1828.

Resolved, That William Dunn, esquire, of Poland, William Cummings, esquire, of Cape Elizabeth, and Edward Russell, esquire, of North Yarmouth, be a committee, at the expense of the town of Gray, to make and establish a dividing line between those towns, being first sworn to the faithful discharge of their trust, and giving seasonable notice to all parties concerned, of the time and place of their meeting ; and it shall be the duty of said committee to describe the boundary line by course and distance; to set up, make and notice in their return, suitable marks and monuments with a view to the permanent establishment of said line; and also make out triplicate returns of their doings, one of which shall be for the town of Gray, one for the town of Windham, and shall forthwith be recorded by the town clerks of those towns respectively, and the other copy returned to the Secretary of this State; and the line so marked, returned and described, shall be the dividing line between said towns

[*Approved by the Governor, February 23, 1828.*]

CHAPTER XLV.

Resolve for the payment of contingent expenses.

Resolved, That there be appropriated the sum of one thousand dollars for the payment of contingent expenses of the current political year, to be placed at the disposal of the Governor and for the expenditure of which he is to be accountable.

CHAPTER XLVI.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the State.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, out of any monies not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons mentioned in ROLL NUMBER NINE, the sums set against such persons names respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of eight thousand, eight hundred, sixty two dollars, fifty cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

CHAPTER XLVII.

Resolve respecting highway taxes.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Assessors of the several towns and plantations in this State to make return to the Secretary of State, on or before the second Wednesday in January next, of the sums assessed in their respective towns and plantations, as a highway tax, in each of the years eighteen hundred twenty four, eighteen hundred twenty five, eighteen hundred twenty six, eighteen hundred twenty seven and eighteen hundred twenty eight, with the price allowed for labor on the roads in each of said years; and of the amount expended in money in each of said years, for materials, building bridges and making roads: and of the poll tax for each of said years, in the highway tax.
