### CHAPTER LI.

Resolve in favor of Thomas Todd.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Thomas Todd, seven hundred and fifty dollars, on account of printing for the State, to be accounted for by said Todd, to the next Legislature, and the Governor, with advice of Council, is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

#### CHAPTER LII.

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Resolve to authorize the Trensurer of the State to dispose of certain articles.

Resolved, That the Treasurer of the State be, and he hereby is authorized and required to sell to the best advantage all the cast iron stoves, with their appendages, belonging to the State, that are now out of use, and hold himself responsible to account for the proceeds.

## CHAPTER LIII.

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Resolve concerning incorporated Literary Institutions.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Trustees of the several incorporated literary institutions in this State to make out a correct statement of the funds, real and personal, belonging to each, attested by their several Treasurers; stating the value of their real estate, as near as may be, including Academy buildings, the amount of their personal estate, and how invested; also what proportion thereof has been derived from the bounty of this State and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and what from individuals; and forward the same to the Secretary of State on or before the first Wednesday of January next; and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to forward a copy of this Resolve to such several Trustees, and lay the returns he may receive before the next Legislature.
