CHAPTER LVI.

Resolve relating to the Boundary Line between Maine and New Hampshire.

Resolved, That the Governor of this State be requested to communicate to the Governor of New Hampshire, the desire of this Legislature to effect an amicable adjustment of the dividing line between the two States; and that he be authorized, with advice of Council, to take such further measures to establish and designate said line, as he may think expedient. [Approved by the Governor, February 25, 1828.]

CHAPTER LVII.

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Resolve in addition to a Resolve, passed at the present session, imposing a tax on the several Counties within this State,

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand dollars, in addition to the sum granted by the Resolve to which this is in addition, be, and hereby is granted, as a tax upon the County of Cumberland, to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and for other purposes, ordered by law.

CHAPTER LVIII.

Resolve providing for repairs of the Senate Chamber.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State be authorized to cause the room occupied by the Senate, to be repaired as he may think proper, and to procure a new carpet, of American manufacture, for the same, prior to the session of the next Legislature, and a sum, not exceeding two hundred dollars, is appropriated for that purpose.
