CHAPTER LXI.

Resolve making an appropriation for two Carriages for the use of the Artillery.

Resolved, That the Governor be authorized to procure, or caused to be procured, two carriages and the necessary apparatus for the use of the Artillery; and to draw his warrant on the Treasurer of the State, for a sum not exceeding four hundred dollars in payment of the same.

[*Approved by the Governor, February 26, 1828.*]

CHAPTER LXII.

Resolve in favor of Charles Miller and Jesse Rowell.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State to Charles Miller the sum of two dollars and fifty cents; and also to Jesse Rowell two dollars and fifty cents, the same being the amount due them for necessary travel in attending the Legislature in eighteen hundred twenty seven, by reason of the Bath Ferry's being obstructed with ice and rendered impassable, and which was omitted from the pay roll of that year by mistake.
