CHAP. 13.

AN ACT repealing part of an Act to establish the Damascotta Canal. Vol. 1, Chapter 64.

Approved February 7, 1829.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the ninth section of "An Act to establish Dam 1821 ch. 64, vol. 1, repealed." ascotta Canal," passed the tenth day of March, eighteen hundred and twenty one, be, and hereby is repealed: Provided however, That the proprietors of said Canal, whenever the same shall Proprietors to give be commenced, shall give bonds with sureties, sa- owners of mills, &c. tisfactory to either of the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court or Court of Common Pleas, for full indemnity to all owners of mills and mill privileges at the outlet of Damascotta pond, who may claim to be injured in their property or estate by the construction of said Canal.

CHAP. 14.

AN ACT to set off Washington Remick from Kittery to Eliot, and to repeal a former Act for the same purpose.

Approved February 7, 1829.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Washington Remick, with his poll and the estate, which he owns in the town of Kittery, Estate set off. in the County of York, be, and hereby is set off from said town of Kittery and annexed to the town of Eliot, in said county: Provided however, That said Remick shall be held to pay all taxes assessed upon him in said town of Kittery, previous to the passing of this Act.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That "An Chap. 1886, vol. 1, Act to set off Washington Remick from Kittery repealed." to Eliot," passed the eighth day of February, eighteen hundred and twenty six, be, and hereby is repealed.
