## CHAP. 17.

Act of 1827, vol. 1, An additional ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of the Falls Sluiceway. chap. 480.

Approved February 12, 1829.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That a further time of two years from and after the passing of this Act, shall be allowed to the Proprietors of the Falls Sluiceway, to erect and complete the Sluiceway, which they were empowered to erect and complete by an act of the Legislature of this State, passed the twenty third day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven, without forfeiting their charter, or losing any powers, privileges or immunities granted them by said Act.*

## CHAP. 18.

AN ACT to cede to the United States a site for a Pier in Saco River.

Approved February 12, 1829.

*SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the United States may purchase or take as hereinafter provided, a lot bounded as fol-*

lows: Beginning at the lower point of land on Chase's point, on Saco River, in the town of Saco, and thence running north twenty degrees east seven rods to the upper point of the ledge; thence north sixty degrees east by the rocks on said point about two rods; thence south twenty degrees west parallel to the first mentioned line to the same lower point so as to include the lower point, and thence to the place of beginning, for the purpose of building a pier thereon, and during the continuance of the use and appropriation aforesaid, the jurisdiction of said lot is hereby ceded to said States: saving that all civil and criminal process issued under the authority of this State shall have full force and effect within the same.

Description of the Territory ceded.

Jurisdiction as to serving civil and criminal process retained.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That if the agent or person employed by the United States, and the owner or owners of said land cannot agree on the sale and purchase thereof, such agent or person may apply to the Court of Common Pleas, or Court of Sessions, to be holden in the county where the land lies, who shall appoint three disinterested freeholders to determine what is a just sum, as an equivalent to the owner or owners of said land, and said freeholders shall be sworn by some Justice of the Peace for the faithful performance of their trust, and shall proceed to view, set off and appraise said land, and shall make return of their doings to the Court appointing them, and the amount of their appraisement being paid to the owner or owners of said land, or if the owner or owners shall not appear, or shall refuse to receive the same, the money shall be paid to such person or corporation as the Court shall order for the use of the owners. And the said land shall vest in said United States and may be taken and possessed for the use aforesaid: *Provided,* That all charges of such appraisement and application shall be paid by said States.

Provision as to the sale and purchase of the territory ceded, in case the Agent of the U. S. and the owner cannot agree.
