CHAP. 20.

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of Alewives in Little River, in the town of Perry.

Approved February 13, 1829.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the owners or occupants of such dam or dams as now are, or hereafter may be erected across Little River, so called, in the town of Perry, in the county of Washington, shall make and maintain a sufficient sluice or fish-way, round, through or over such dam, or dams, for the passage of Alewives, and shall keep the same open and free from all obstructions, from the twentieth day of May to the first day of July in each year; and any owner or occupant of such dam, or dams, who shall neglect to make, maintain and keep open such fish-way as herein directed, shall forfeit and pay the sum of one hundred dollars, to be recovered by action of debt in any Court of competent jurisdiction, one moiety thereof to the use of said town of Perry, and the other moiety thereof to the use of any person who may sue therefor.

CHAP. 21.

AN ACT to annex a part of the town of Surry to the town of Ellsworth.

Approved February 17, 1829.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so much of the town of Surry, in the County of Hancock, as is included within the following boundaries, viz: beginning on the west side of Union River, at the corner of Elias Lord's south lot; thence westerly on the south line of said lot

to the head thereof; thence north thirty degrees west one mile; thence westerly by a right line to the outlet of Patten's lower Pond; thence westerly by said Pond and the stream which connects the same with the upper Pond, and said upper Pond to the west line of Surry; thence by the west line of Surry to the south-west corner of Ellsworth; thence by the southerly line of Ellsworth easterly to Union River; thence by Union River southerly to the place began at, be, and hereby is set off from said town of Surry and annexed to the town of Ellsworth in said county; and the inhabitants thereof shall there exercise and enjoy all the rights and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and requisitions of the other inhabitants of said town of Ellsworth: *Provided however,* That the inhabitants of Surry thus set off, shall be holden to pay all taxes assessed upon them in the town of Surry, and remaining unpaid, prior to the passing of this Act; and shall be held and bound to pay their due and just proportion of any public debt which may be due and owing from said town of Surry, at the time of the passing of this Act.

Inhabitants thus set off, holden to pay their proportions of all debts, &c. due from Surry, prior to the passage of this Act.



CHAP. 22.

AN ACT to incorporate the Springvale Printworks Company.

Approved February 17, 1829.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Luke Whitney, Edward Jackson, and Matthew Hodgson, their associates and successors, be, and hereby are created a body corporate by the name of the Springvale Printworks Company, for the purpose of calico printing and bleaching in all their various branches, in the town of Sanford, in the county of York; with power, by
