that name, to prosecute and defend suits at law ; Powers as to choosing officers, making by-laws, &c. to have and use a common seal ; to choose all such officers as may be necessary for the management of their corporate business ; to make any by-laws for the regulation of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the State ; and to exercise and enjoy such other powers and privileges as usually appertain to manufacturing corporations.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate, to an amount, not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, at any one time ; and may erect and maintain on such real estate, any dams, mills, works, machines, and buildings, that may be necessary or useful in carrying on the business of said corporation ; and may give, grant, bargain and sell the same, at pleasure. And so much of the capital stock, property and estate of said corporation, as may actually be invested, shall be exempt from taxation for the term of five years. May hold real and personal estate to the amt. of \$100,000. Exempt from taxation 5 years.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this Act may be enlarged, restrained or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature. Powers may be restricted.



## CHAP 23.

AN ACT to incorporate the Eastport Savings Bank.

Approved February 17, 1829.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That John Burgin, Edward Ilsley, Joseph C. Noyes, George Hobbs, Benjamin King, Samuel Rice, Otis Kimball, Levi Ingols, Persons incorporated. their associates and successors, be, and hereby are constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Eastport Savings Bank ; with

power by that name to prosecute and defend suits at law ; to have and use a common seal ; to make any by-laws for the convenient management of their concerns, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of the State ; and to exercise and enjoy all the rights and privileges incident to such corporations. And all deeds, grants, conveyances, covenants and agreements made by any person under their authority and direction, pursuant to their by-laws, shall be valid.

May receive deposits.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said corporation may receive from any person or persons, any deposite or deposites of money, and may use the same for the purposes hereinafter provided.

Deposites how managed.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That all deposites of money, received by said corporation, shall be used to the best advantage, and the net income or profit thereof shall be by them divided among the persons making such deposites, their executors, administrators or assigns, in just proportion; and such deposites may be withdrawn at such reasonable times, and in such manner as said corporation shall appoint.

First meeting.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said corporation may be called at such time and place in Eastport, as may be directed by a majority of the persons herein named, by giving notice thereof in the Eastport Sentinel, at least ten days previous thereto,—at which and every subsequent annual meeting, said corporation may elect by ballot any person or persons, as members thereof—may choose such officers as to them may seem proper for their organization and government, who shall so continue one year and until others are chosen in their stead. And the

persons elected Treasurer and Secretary, before entering upon their official duties, shall be sworn to the faithful performance thereof ; and the former shall also give bonds satisfactory to said corporation for the faithful discharge of his duties.

SECT. 5. *Be it further enacted*, That the annual meetings of said corporation shall be holden at Eastport in the month of April, at which, as well as all other meetings seven members including either the President, Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer shall form a quorum. And meetings may be directed at any other times by the President or the Corporation.

Quorum.

SECT. 6. *Be it further enacted*, That the powers, granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restricted, or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

## CHAP. 24.

AN ACT to annex part of the town of China to the town of Vassalborough.

Approved February 18, 1829.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled*, That all that part of the south-west corner of the town of China, lying west of the three mile pond, so called, be, and the same hereby is set off from the town of China and annexed to the town of Vassalborough: *Provided*, That the inhabitants of, and owners of land in, the part thus set off, shall be held to pay all taxes legally assessed upon them by said town of China, prior to the passing of this Act.

Description of territory set off.

Inhabitants set off, holden to pay all assessments, &c. made prior to the passage of this act.

## CHAP. 25.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of Anson Bridge.

Approved February 18, 1829.
