**CHAP. 40.**

AN ACT to incorporate the Maine Manufacturing Company, for the encouragement and improvement of Machinery and Colouring and Dressing Cloth.

Approved February 21, 1829.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That Samuel Jewett, Lewis Stacy, Oliver Wyman, John O' Craig, Daniel Ormsby, Milton Philbrook and Thomas Jones, with their associates and successors, be, and hereby are created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Maine Manufacturing Company, for the encouragement and improvement of machinery and colouring and dressing cloth; with power by that name to prosecute and defend suits at law; to have a common seal; to purchase, take and hold real and personal estate, to an amount, not exceeding ten thousand dollars; to choose such officers, as may be necessary for the convenient management of their concerns; to make any by-laws for the government of said company, not repugnant to the laws of this State; and with all the powers and privileges incident to other similar corporate bodies, and subject to all the provisions prescribed by the several Acts, defining the general powers and duties of manufacturing corporations.

Persons incorporated.

Powers, &c.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said company may be called by any three of the persons herein named, by giving public notice of the time and place of such meeting, in such manner as they may think proper.

First meeting.

Votes.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That at all meetings of the said company, each member shall be entitled to one vote for each share owned by him: *Provided however,* That no member shall be entitled to more than ten votes. And absent members may vote by proxy duly authorized in writing.

Powers herein granted subject to revision by Legislature.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers and privileges granted by this Act may be enlarged, restrained or annulled by the Legislature at pleasure.



## CHAP. 41.

Vol. 1, chap. 315. AN ACT in addition to "An Act to incorporate the President, Directors and Company of the Vassalborough Bank.

Approved February 24, 1829.

President and Directors authorized to remove the Bank to Hallowell.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the President, Directors and Company of the Vassalborough Bank, be, and hereby are authorized to remove said Bank, now established at Vassalborough to Hallowell in the County of Kennebec; and there to transact all such business as by their Act of incorporation they are authorized to do at Vassalborough, any thing in said Act to the contrary notwithstanding: *Provided,* The removal hereby authorized, be made within one year from the passing of this Act.

Proviso.

All demands against the Bank to be paid at the Banking house in Hallowell.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That every person who may have demands on the President, Directors and Company of Vassalborough Bank, whether by bills issued by said Bank, on bond or otherwise, shall have the right of making demand for payment of the same at the Banking-house of said Bank in Hallowell, although said bill or bills, bond or other securities, issued for and in behalf
