of said corporation may have been dated in Vassalborough; and the said President, Directors and Company shall be under the same obligation to pay the same, and subject to the same penalties in case of neglect or refusal so to do, that they would be liable to, if the demand was made at said Bank in Vassalborough.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That as soon as the said Bank shall be removed to the town of President and Directors to give notice of the President the Allowell, it shall be the duty of the President the and Directors thereof, to give notice of such restate, and public moval in writing to the Treasurer of the State; and also to give public notice thereof, by publishing the same, three weeks successively in the newspaper printed for the State, and in the newspapers printed in Hallowell.

SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That so much of "an Act to incorporate the Vassal-Part of Act of 1925 borough Bank" passed the twenty-second day of chap. 315, Vol. 1, February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be, and hereby is

repealed.

AN ACT ceding to the United States the jurisdiction of a certain tract of land in the town of Castine.

Approved February 25, 1829.

SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That there be, and hereby is ceded to the United States, the jurisdiction of a lot of land, Boundaries of the situate in the town of Castine, on part of which is now erected a Light House and keeper's house, bounded and described as follows, viz: beginning at a stake and stones near Dice's Head, on a

course south eighty nine degrees west, fifteen rods distant from the base of the Light house; thence north seventy three degrees east, twenty one rods; thence south seventeen degrees east twenty three rods; thence south seventy three degrees west to Penobscot Bay; thence on the Bay northerly, to the place of beginning.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That this State Concurrent juris-shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the United States, in and over the territory described in this Act, and the houses thereon erected, so far, as that all civil and military processes, issued under the authority of this State, or any officer thereof, may be executed on any part of the said granted premises, or in any building that is or may be erected thereon, in the same way and manner, as if the jurisdiction thereof had not been ceded as aforesaid.

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CHAP.

AN ACT to incorporate the Ellsworth Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Approved February 25, 1829.

Sect. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That Leonard Jarvis, Joshua W. Hathaway, Charles Jarvis and Edward S. Jarvis, with their associates and successors, being owners of buildings, shall be a corporation under the name of the Ellsworth Mutual Fire Insurance Company, who shall keep their office at Ellsworth, and enjoy all privileges and powers incident to such corporations.

Office to be kept at Ellsworth.

> Sect. 2. Be it further enacted, That at all meetings of said corporation, every matter shall be decided by a majority of votes, each member having as many votes as he has policies, with the right of voting by proxy; and said corporation may
