NINTH LEGISLATURE,

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE SEVENTH DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON
THE SIXTH DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUN-
DRED AND TWENTY NINE.

lots of land in the east half of township number six in the second range of townships, north of Bingham's purchase in Penobscot County : Upon condition, that each of the above named persons who shall, within two years, make selection of a lot of land under this Resolve, and notify the Land Agent of the number of the lot selected, shall within three years after such selection be made, cause five acres of such lot to be cleared and improved, and a house to be built, and shall cause a family to reside thereon. And upon performance of the foregoing conditions, the Land Agent is authorized, empowered and directed to execute to each of the above named persons, who shall exhibit to him satisfactory evidence of such performance, his heirs or legal representatives, a good and sufficient deed of the lot by him selected, to have and to hold the same in fee simple, to him, his heirs and assigns forever.

RESOLVED, That the Land Agent cause the above mentioned half township to be surveyed and laid out into lots of one hundred and sixty acres each, within one year from the passing of this Resolve.

CHAP. 17.

Resolve laying a tax on the several Counties in this State.

Approved February 14, 1829.

RESOLVED, That the sums annexed to the several Counties, contained in the following schedule, be, and the same are hereby granted as a tax for each county respectively to be apportioned, assessed, collected and applied, for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and for other purposes ordered by law.

YORK,	Six thousand dollars.
CUMBERLAND,	Fourteen thousand dollars.
LINCOLN,	Four thousand and nine hundred dollars.
KENNEBEC,	Six thousand dollars.
HANCOCK,	Three thousand dollars.
WASHINGTON,	Four thousand four hundred and thirty five dollars.
OXFORD,	Five thousand dollars.
SOMERSET,	Three thousand and three hundred dollars.
PENOBSCOT,	Six thousand and seventy dollars.
WALDO,	Seven thousand dollars.
