**CHAP. 26.**

**Resolve for the benefit of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary.**

Approved February 20, 1829.

**RESOLVED,** That there be, and hereby is granted to the Maine Wesleyan Seminary, the sum of six hundred dollars, to be paid out of the Treasury of the State, in two equal annual payments, the first payment to be made on the first day of April next.

**CHAP. 27.**

**Resolve relating to fortifications on the Penobscot River and Bay.**

Approved February 27, 1829.

**RESOLVED,** That the Senators in Congress from this State be instructed, and the Representatives requested to use their influence to obtain an appropriation for the purpose of erecting and repairing, as soon as may be, fortifications on the Penobscot Bay and River, sufficient for the protection thereof;—and that the Governor be requested to communicate this Resolve to the Senators and Representatives in such manner as he may think proper.

**CHAP. 28.**

**Resolve authorizing the Penobscot Tribe of Indians to sell Smith's Island.**

Approved February 27, 1829.

**RESOLVED,** That the Governor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians, the principal Chiefs and a majority of said Tribe, under the advice of their Agent, be, and hereby are authorized to sell a certain Island in Penobscot River, called Smith's island, situated above and near Old town falls, so called, and containing about one acre and a half of land, to Nathan Winslow. And the deed of the Governor and principal chiefs of said tribe of Indians conveying said Island to said Winslow, when approved and countersigned by the Land Agent of this State, shall be considered and held as evidence of a good title to the fee of said
