CHAP. 39.

Resolve appointing Commissioners to settle with certain Land Agents.

Approved March 3, 1829.

RESOLVED, That Jabez Mowry, Esquire, of Lubec, jointly with the Land Agent of this State, be a committee, vested with full power and authority to inquire into and investigate the doings and accounts of all the Land Agents appointed by virtue of Resolves passed June twenty sixth, one thousand eight hundred and twenty ; February sixth, one thousand eight hundred and twenty two; and February eighth, one thousand eight hundred and twenty three; and to adjust and finally settle the same. And to make report of their doings to the Governor and Council as soon as may be after they shall have performed the duties to which they are hereby appointed.

CHAP. 40.

Resolve in favor of James Irish.

Approved March 3, 1829.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State to James Irish, the sum of three hundred and thirty three dollars and thirty three cents, in full for his services and personal expenses, as Land Agent, from the third of March to the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight : *Provided however*, That said sum shall not be paid by the Treasurer to said Irish until he shall have settled and accounted with the Governor and Council for all monies due from him as Land Agent.

CHAP. 41.

Resolve for the purchase of Stationary and other articles.

Approved March 4, 1829.

RESOLVED, That there be appropriated the sum of four hundred dollars for the purchase of Stationary and other articles necessary for the use of the several offices and of the Legislature; not otherwise provided for ; to be placed in the hands of the Secretary of State, and for the faithful expenditure of which he is to be accountable.
