NINTH LEGISLATURE,

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE SEVENTH DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON
THE SIXTH DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUN-
DRED AND TWENTY NINE.

CHAP. 57.

Resolve fixing the compensation of certain Officers.

Approved March 6, 1829.

RESOLVED, That hereafter, the Messengers of the Senate and of the House of Representatives, shall respectively receive the sum of two dollars for each day by them engaged in the service of that branch of the Legislature to which they belong ; and that each assistant by them necessarily employed shall receive the sum of one dollar for each day's attendance.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Draftsman employed by the Legislature to draw Bills and Resolves, shall receive two dollars for each day by him employed in that service ; and the Assistant Secretary of the Senate, and the Assistant Clerk of the House of Representatives, shall each receive the sum of two dollars for each day of the sitting of the Legislature.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the compensations above named shall be in full discharge for the respective services abovenamed.

CHAP. 58.

Resolve providing compensation for certain Officers.

Approved March 6, 1829.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, to the Clerk employed by the Legislature for drafting Bills and Resolves, a sum not exceeding three dollars for each day thus employed, his account being first examined and allowed by the Governor and Council ; to the Messenger of the Senate and such assistants as he may have employed, four dollars per day ; to the Messenger of the Governor and Council, for each day he shall be employed as such two dollars ; and to the Chaplain of the Senate thirty dollars in full for his services. To the Chaplains of the House who have officiated as such, at the present session, five dollars each.
