County line to conform to the line above described.

Clinton, as established by this Act, shall be, and constitute, the dividing line, between the counties of Kennebec and Somerset, so far as the same runs between said counties, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.



## CHAP. 72.

AN ACT to annex a part of the town of Anson to New Portland:

Approved March 6, 1830.

Description of territory set off, &c.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That* so much of the town of Anson, in the county of Somerset, as is included within the following boundaries, viz. : beginning on Seven Mile Brook at the north east corner of land owned by William Quint, thence west, on said Quint's north line to the east line of New Portland, thence north on the east line of said New Portland to Seven Mile Brook, thence by said Seven Mile Brook to the place began at, be, and hereby is set off from said town of Anson, and annexed to the town of New Portland in said county. *Provided, That* the owners of land, in the part thus set off, shall be held to pay all taxes legally assessed upon them, by said town of Anson, prior to the passing of this Act.

Proviso, as to arrears of taxes.
