## CHAP. 75.

AN ACT to change the name of the first Evangelical Congregational Church and Society in Eastport.

Approved March 6, 1830.

Name altered to  
"Central Congre-  
gational Society."

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Religious Society in Eastport, incorporated in pursuance of the provisions of the Act, entitled, "An Act concerning Parishes," by the name of "the First Evangelical Congregational Church and Society in Eastport," shall hereafter be known, called and established, by the name of the Central Congregational Society in Eastport.*



## CHAP. 76.

An additional ACT to incorporate the proprietors of Canton Point Bridge

Approved, March 6, 1830.

*SECT. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That three years, from and after the expiration of the time allowed in the fourth section of the Act to which this is additional, be, and hereby are allowed the Proprietors of Canton Point Bridge, for building and completing said bridge.*

Time for building  
the bridge extended  
three years.

*SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the bridge aforesaid shall be from sixteen to twenty six feet in width.*

Width.

*SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That, so much of the second and fourth sections of the Act, to which this is additional, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be, and hereby is repealed.*
