Transfers of Stock  
regulated;

SECT. 7. *Be it further enacted,* That no transfer of stock in said Bank shall be of any effect, until entered on the transfer book of said corporation, and the transfer made and signed in the presence of the cashier, or one director, by such stockholder making such transfer, or his attorney lawfully authorized for that purpose, or the writing on which such transfer is made, be duly executed in the presence of two credible witnesses, and left with the cashier of said Bank.

Returns to specify  
names of Directors.

SECT. 8. *Be it further enacted,* That each return of the state of said Bank, to be made pursuant to the first section of an Act directing the mode and time of making returns, shall in addition to the several particulars required therein to be included, specify the names of all the directors of said Bank; and if, in taking the oath required by said first section, any director or cashier shall swear falsely, and be thereof duly convicted, he shall suffer as for wilful and corrupt perjury.



## CHAP. 93.

AN ACT to change the name of West Machias.

Approved March 12, 1830.

Name changed to  
Machias.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That from and after the passing of this Act, the town of West Machias, in the county of Washington, shall be called and known by the name of Machias; and shall be entitled to all the privileges and immunities, and subject to all the liabilities to which it was entitled and subjected before the passing of this Act, and all suits and matters pending in, and all writs, precepts, processes, and recognizances returnable to either of the Courts to be holden at

West Machias, shall be returned to, entered and proceeded upon and heard at said Courts to be held at Machias.



## CHAP. 94.

AN ACT to annex part of the town of Denmark to the town of Sebago,

Approved, March 12, 1830.

*BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That* from and after the passing of this Act, so much of the town of Denmark, in the county of Oxford, as is known by the name of the mile square, with lots numbers seventeen, eighteen and nineteen, all lying easterly and southerly from the Great Hancock Pond, and extending westerly to Brownfield old line, be, and hereby is set off from said town, and annexed to the town of Sebago, in the county of Cumberland, and the dividing line between the counties of Cumberland and Oxford, shall be varied accordingly, so as to include the tract aforesaid within the county of Cumberland; and the inhabitants thereof shall there exercise and enjoy all the rights and privileges of, and be subject to the same duties and requisitions, as the other inhabitants of said town: *Provided however, That* the inhabitants of said Denmark, hereby set off to said Sebago, shall be held to pay all assessments upon them, remaining unpaid, to said town of Denmark, prior to this Act, and the inhabitants, set off as aforesaid, shall be entitled to the benefit of the money raised for the support of schools in the tract so set off, which has been assessed previous to, and remains unexpended at the time of the passing of this Act,

Description of the territory set off, &c.

Inhabitants set off; to pay all assessments already made and be entitled to money assessed for schools.
