## CHAP. 101.

AN ACT to establish the dividing line between Palermo and China.

Approved March 15, 1830.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That from and after the passing of this Act, the dividing line between the towns of Palermo, in the county of Waldo, and China, in the county of Kennebec, be, and hereby is established as follows, viz. beginning at the northeasterly corner of lot number eighty six, in said China ; thence south, thirty two degrees west, by the easterly line of said lot, and lot number eighty-seven, to the north end of the gore, so called, in said China, as lotted or laid out by Broadstreet Wiggins ; thence on the same course, following the easterly line of said gore, to a stone monument, erected on the southerly side of the county road ; near the house of Joseph Hacker, in said Palermo ; thence on the same course, following said line, to a beech tree, standing on the northerly side of a county road leading from Augusta to Belfast ; thence on the same course, following the said gore line, to the south easterly corner of said gore, having more particular reference to said line and monuments than to the course.

Division line described.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the above described line be, and hereby is made and

established the dividing line, in part between the counties of Kennebec and Waldo, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.



## CHAP. 102.

AN ACT to incorporate the Proprietors of the Bangor Pier Corporation.

Approved March 15, 1830.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That William Emerson, Amos Patten, Moses Patten, James B. Fiske, Wiggins Hill, James McLaughlin, Samuel Lowder, and Samuel Lowder jun. all of Bangor, in the county of Penobscot, their associates and successors, be, and hereby are created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Bangor Pier Corporation ; with power to sue and be sued ; to have a common seal, and to change the same at pleasure ; and to make rules and by-laws for the management and regulation of their real and personal estate, and of their common concerns, not repugnant to the laws of this State ; and to have, exercise and enjoy the usual rights and privileges of similar corporate bodies.

Persons incorporat-

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That said corporation may hold such real estate as is now owned by the corporators above named, being part of lots number six and seven, in said town, according to the survey of Park Holland, under the authority of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and adjoining the land and flats owned by said town, called the burying-ground lot, and such personal estate as is necessary for the enjoyment and exercise of the powers granted by this Act, and shall have power to sell, grant and alien in fee simple, or otherwise, their corporate property,
