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happen within the same, subsequent to the assessment of the tax made by this act, excepting such parishes and societies, for which a different provision for assessing their taxes, is made by law: Provided always, That it shall be lawful for any town, parish, society or plantation to make, levy provided always, according to a new valuation, and for that purpose to cause a new valuation to be taken therein, at any time of the year which may be determined upon, at a legal meeting to be warned for that purpose.

Sect. 8. 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CHAP. 106.

AN ACT authorizing the Court of Sessions for the county of Cumberland to lay out a road over a creek, or arm of the sea in Freeport.

Approved March 16, 1830.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Court of Sessions for the county of Cumber-Location of the land, be, and hereby are authorized, to cause a road to be located and laid out from Porter's landing, in Freeport, to a road leading to Strout's Point, to cross a creek or arm of the sea, in Freeport, in front of Joseph Porter's house: Provided, It shall be determined by said court to be of common convenience or necessity: And provided fur-Provine, ther, That a sufficient passage-way shall be made
