CHAP. 110.

An additional ACT to incorporate the Trustees of the Methodist Society in Portland.

Approved, March 16, 1830.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That from and after the passing of this Act, the number of the trustees of said corporation may be enlarged to any number, not exceeding thirteen, five of whom, including the president shall constitute a quorum to transact business.

Number of trustees may be increased to 13—five including the President to constitute a quorum.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That any thing contained in the second section of an Act passed the twenty eighth (19th) day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one, to which this is additional, contrary to the provisions of this Act, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

Part of 2nd Sect. Chap. 41 repealed.



CHAP. 111.

AN ACT to annex part of the town of Topsham to the town of Bowdoinham.

Approved March 16, 1830.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That so much of the town of Topsham, in the county of Lincoln, as is included within the following boundaries, viz. : beginning on Muddy River on the north east corner of Willis Sprague's land, thence running on said Sprague's north line to Cathance river, thence down said Cathance river, to the mouth of Muddy river, thence up said Muddy river to the first mentioned bounds; meaning to include that part of Topsham, except the

Bounds of the territory annexed.
