CHAP. 113.

An Act to divide the town of Mount Desert and incorporate the town of Cranberry Isles.

Approved March 16, 1830.

Be it enacted by the Senate and SECT. 1. House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Islands constituting a part of the town of Mount Desert, in the county of Hancock, known by the name of Great Cranberry, Little Cranberry, Sutton's and Baker's Islands, with the inhabitants thereof, be, and the same hereby are incorporated into a town by the name of Cranberry Isles.

Be it further enacted, inhabitants of said town of Cranberry Isles, shall be holden to pay the arrears of all taxes which To pay arrears of have been legally assessed on them, together with proportion of debts their proportion of all debts due from said town of

Mount Desert, at the time this act shall take effect; and the said town of Cranberry Isles, shall be entitled to receive and hold their proportion of the debts and taxes due to said town of Mount Desert when collected and paid to said town, and also their proportion of all the real and personal property of said town of Mount Desert, now owned in common by the inhabitants of said towns, said proportion to be ascertained by the last valuation of said town of Mount Desert.

Sect. 3. Be it further enacted, inhabitants of said town of Cranberry Isles, shall be holden to pay their proportion towards the support of all paupers, actually chargeable upon the

Description of territory.

Paupers, how divided,

town of Mount Desert, when this Act shall take effect; said proportion to be ascertained by the valuation aforesaid; or take such paupers as may be their proportion as aforesaid. And all persons who may, or shall hereafter become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as belonging to that town, on whose territory they may have gained a legal settlement, and shall be supported by the same.

SECT. 4. Be it further enacted, That until a new general valuation be taken, the State and Proportion of State County Taxes, which may be required of the and County taxes to town of Mount Desert, shall be apportioned upon town until new valuation. said towns of Mount Desert and Cranberry Isles, as follows; eleven fourteenths upon Mount Desert, and three fourteenths upon Cranberry Isles.

Sect. 6. Be it further enacted, That said town of Cranberry Isles, shall be classed with the Mt. Desert & Eden said town of Mount Desert and the town Eden, sentative, sentative, for the purpose of electing a Representative to the Legislature of this State, until otherwise provided by law.
