town of Mount Desert, when this Act shall take effect ; said proportion to be ascertained by the valuation aforesaid ; or take such paupers as may be their proportion as aforesaid. And all persons who may, or shall hereafter become chargeable as paupers, shall be considered as belonging to that town, on whose territory they may have gained a legal settlement, and shall be supported by the same.

SECT. 4. *Be it further enacted,* That the several collectors of taxes for the town of Mount Desert aforesaid, are hereby authorized and empowered to collect and pay all taxes to them already committed, agreeably to their several warrants, any thing in this Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Collectors of Mt. Desert to complete their collections of taxes already committed to them.

SECT. 5. *Be it further enacted,* That until a new general valuation be taken, the State and County Taxes, which may be required of the town of Mount Desert, shall be apportioned upon said towns of Mount Desert and Cranberry Isles, as follows ; eleven fourteenths upon Mount Desert, and three fourteenths upon Cranberry Isles.

Proportion of State and County taxes to be paid by each town until new valuation.

SECT. 6. *Be it further enacted,* That said town of Cranberry Isles, shall be classed with the said town of Mount Desert and the town Eden, for the purpose of electing a Representative to the Legislature of this State, until otherwise provided by law.

To be classed with Mt. Desert & Eden to choose a Representative.



CHAP. 114.

AN ACT authorizing the Courts of Sessions in the Counties of Cumberland and Lincoln to lay out a road over the New Meadows River.

Approved March 17, 1830.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That the Courts of Sessions for the counties of Cum-

Road may be laid over N. M. River, provided the towns of Bath and Brunswick assent to the provisions of this act within two years

berland and Lincoln, be and they are hereby authorized, to cause a road to be laid out over the tide waters of the New Meadows or Stevens' River, between the towns of Brunswick and Bath, running from the village in Bath to the village in Brunswick: *Provided*, The laying out of said road, shall be determined by said courts, to be of common convenience or necessity: *And provided further*, That not more than one half of the expense of erecting a bridge on said road over said river, shall be assessed on the inhabitants of said town of Brunswick: *And provided further*, That the inhabitants of the towns of Brunswick and Bath shall at their annual meeting in the months of March, April or September, or at any other meeting legally called for this purpose, within two years from the passing of this Act, by a majority of the voters present, give their assent to the provisions of this bill.



CHAP. 115.

AN ACT to annex a part of Otisfield to Oxford.

Approved March 17, 1830.

Boundaries of territory annexed.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That all that part of the east corner of the town of Otisfield, in the county of Cumberland, situated east of Thompson Pond, together with a strip of land belonging to the State, lying between said Otisfield and the town of Poland, (which tract of territory is bounded on the west and north-west, by Thompson Pond, south and south-west by Poland, and east and north-east, by Oxford) be, and hereby is set off from said town of Otisfield, and annexed to the town of Oxford, in the county of Oxford; and the dividing line between the
