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# RESOLVES

OF THE

TENTH LEGISLATURE,

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

PASSED AT THE SESSION,

WHICH COMMENCED ON THE SIXTH DAY OF JANUARY, AND ENDED ON  
THE NINETEENTH DAY OF MARCH ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUN-  
DRED AND THIRTY.

our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, in cutting timber upon the lots of land, in the Wait township, so called, in the county aforesaid, purchased of the State in May last by the said Pike, and also for trespasses committed by some person or persons in cutting timber upon part of Township number two, by Titcomb's survey in the first range, north of the Bingham purchase, east of Penobscot river, in said county, purchased of the State by the said Pike ; that the said Pike shall have all the rights, powers and privileges which the State had at the time of the said purchases ; and that for the recovery of damages for the trespasses aforesaid, the said Pike be, and hereby is authorized and empowered to commence and prosecute to final judgment, in the name of the State, against any person or persons supposed to have committed the trespasses aforesaid, any action or actions that shall be necessary in any court of competent jurisdiction : *Provided*, That the said Pike shall pay the State for all expenses incurred by it respecting said timber, cut as aforesaid, for which he shall receive payment.

RESOLVED, That if in any action, commenced by said Pike, pursuant to the foregoing resolve, the defendant or defendants shall prevail, judgment and execution shall be awarded by the Court directly against the said Pike, in the same way and manner as if such action had been commenced and prosecuted in his own name ; and it shall be stated in the writ in every such action, that the same is commenced and prosecuted by said Pike by virtue of this Resolve.

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## CHAP. 11.

Resolve granting a pension to David Sevey.

Approved March 5, 1830.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, to David Sevey, of East Machias, three dollars per month, annually, for the term of three years, if he shall so long live, to commence on the first day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

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## CHAP. 12.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Young.

Approved March 5, 1830.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury to Joseph Young of Pittston, the sum of thirty seven dollars

and five cents, it being the amount of his legal fees, for committing John Reed Jun. of Clinton, to Augusta jail, in eighteen hundred and twenty eight, on three executions, State of Maine against John Reed Jun.

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### CHAP. 13.

Resolve in favor of George Sawtell.

Approved March 5, 1830.

**RESOLVED**, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State to George Sawtell of Sidney, (in consideration of a severe injury received while performing military duty) the sum of two dollars per month for three years, if he shall so long live, to be paid annually ; and to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

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### CHAP. 14.

Resolve relative to the State Prison.

Approved March 5, 1830.

**RESOLVED**. That the Warden, with the advice and assistance of the Inspectors, be authorized and empowered to enlarge the Wharf and Prison Yard, by adding two hundred and nineteen feet in length and twenty one in width.

**RESOLVED FURTHER**, That the Chaplain, with the advice and direction of the Warden and Inspectors, be, and hereby is authorized and empowered to purchase books for the use of the Prison, to an amount not exceeding seventy-five dollars.

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### CHAP. 15.

Resolve making an appropriation for the Warden of the State Prison.

Approved March 5, 1830.

**RESOLVED**, That the sum of seven thousand three hundred twenty-nine dollars and thirty eight cents, is appropriated to the use of the Warden of the State Prison, being the amount of the balance due him on his account, for purchases and disbursements for the use of said Prison.
