CHAP. 36.

Resolve in favor of Day & Fraser.

Approved March 18, 1830.

RESOLVED, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to Day & Fraser, sixty days after the passage of this Resolve, six hundred dollars, on account of printing for the State, to be accounted for by said Day & Fraser, to the next Legislature; and the Governor, with advice of Council, is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

CHAP. 37.

Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved March 18, 1830.

RESOLVED, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, out of any monies not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons mentioned in Roll number eleven, the sums set against such person's names respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of six thousand eight hundred ninety five dollars and forty seven cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.

CHAP. 38.

Resolve authorizing a temporary loan in behalf of the State.

Approved March 18, 1830.

RESOLVED, That the Treasurer of this State be, and hereby is authorized to obtain on the faith of the State, a loan not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding five per cent. per annum, and for a period not exceeding one year.

CHAP. 39.

Resolve providing for the settlement of certain accounts.

Approved March 18, 1830.

RESOLVED, That the Governor, with advice of Council be, and he hereby is authorized and empowered to settle with all persons having accounts with the State, which were unsettled, on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty nine, allowing the claims of such persons against the State, or such
