* "In Convention of the members of the House of Representatives, and members of the Senate elect, Feb. 2, 1830.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be requested to notify John Bodwell, Abijah Usher Jun. and Nathan D. Appleton, Esquires, this day elected as Senators to supply the deficiencies in the District of York, and also Obadiah Hill, Esquire, elected as Senator to supply the deficiency in the District of Washington, of their election, and to request their attendance forthwith, and that he be requested when they arrive to conduct them to the Council Chamber to be qualified, and afterwards introduce them into the Senate Chamber."

IN SENATE, FEBRUARY 8, 1830.

"ORDERED, That said four Senators, "[John Bodwell, Abijah Usher Jr. Nathan D. Appleton and Obadiah Hill]" were duly and constitutionally elected to fill vacancies existing, and that the three first above named, having been qualified are entitled to seats at this board, and to all the rights and privileges of Senators elected by the people."

IN SENATE, FEB. 11, 1830.

"RESOLVED, That the said Nathan D. Appleton, John Bodwell, Abijah Usher jr. and Obadiah Hill, have not been constitutionally elected Senators, and are not entitled to seats at the Senate Board."

The gentlemen above named were not permitted to vote at the Senate Board after the passage of the forgoing Resolve, and no other persons were elected to fill the vacancies.
