CHAPTER DVI.

AN ADDITIONAL ACT relating to Enginemen.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That whenever any town, corporation or individuals, shall possess and keep for public use, any Fire Engine, the Selectmen of any town in which the same is so kept, are hereby empowered to appoint any number of suitable persons they may deem necessary not exceeding sixty to each engine, if such engine have suction hose and not exceeding thirty-five if without suction hose, to be enginemen; and the enginemen so appointed, shall be exempted from all military duty, except that of being detached or called forth to execute the laws, to suppress rebellion, or to repel invasion; *Provided,* That every engineman claiming exemption from military duty by virtue of this act shall first produce to the commanding officer of the Company to which they respectively belong, on or before the second Tuesday of September annually, the certificate of such Selectmen, certifying that he has been duly appointed an engineman, and that he faithfully performs the duties thereof. And such engineman so appointed, shall be liable to all the duties and penalties and entitled to all other privileges and exemptions provided by the Acts, to which this is additional.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That all Acts, and parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be, and the same are hereby repealed

Acts repealed.
