STATE OF MAINE.

CHAPTER 120.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Stetson.

Approved January 28, 1831.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That the Plantation hitherto known by the name of Stetson, in the county of Penobscot, bounded North by the town of Exeter, South by the towns of Etna and Carmel, West by Newport, and East by Levant, be, and hereby is incorporated into a town by the name of Stetson. Boundaries of town described. And the inhabitants of said town are hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and immunities, which the inhabitants of towns within this State, do or may by law enjoy. Powers and privileges.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That any Justice of the Peace within said county, is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town, directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof, to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers, as other towns are empowered to choose, at their annual town meetings. First meeting.
