CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT to incorporate the First Roman Catholic Society in the town of Hope.

Approved February 1, 1831.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That John Hanley, William Keating and John Keating, with their associates and successors, be, and they hereby are, incorporated into a body politic by the name of the "First Roman Catholic Society in the town of Hope"; with power to sue and be sued; to have a common seal, and change the same; to make any by-laws not repugnant to the laws of this State; to take by gift, grant, or purchase, any estate, real, or personal, to the amount of ten thousand dollars; and to give, grant, or bargain and sell the same; and shall have all the powers and privileges incident by law to parishes and religious Societies.

Names of persons incorporated.

Powers and privileges.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the first meeting of said corporation, shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such manner, as the majority of the persons herein named may direct.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 3. *Be it further enacted,* That the powers granted by this Act, may be enlarged, restrained or annulled, at the pleasure of the Legislature.

Powers, &c. may be changed.
