#### CHAPTER 123.

AN ACT to incorporate the First Roman Catholic Society in the town of Hope.

Approved February 1, 1831.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled, That John Hanley, William Keating and Sons incorporated, That John Healey, William Keating and Sons incorporated. Sors, be, and they hereby are, incorporated into a body politic by the name of the "First Roman Catholic Society in the town of Hope"; with power to sue and be sued; to have a common seal, and change the same; to make any by-laws not repugnant to the laws of this State; to take by gift, grant, or purchase, any estate, real, or personal, to the amount of ten thousand dollars; and to give, grant, or bargain and sell the same; and shall have all the powers and privileges in-Powers and cident by law to parishes and religious Societies.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That the first meeting of said corporation, shall be holden at such time and place, and be notified in such how called. manner, as the majority of the persons herein

named may direct.

SECT. 3. Be it further enacted, That the powers granted by this Act, may be enlarged, re-Powers, &c. strained or annulled, at the pleasure of the Le-ed. gislature.
