CHAPTER 139.

AN ACT to set off Nathaniel Malbon from Cornville to Milburn.

Approved February 23, 1831.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in Legislature assembled,* That so much of the farm of Nathaniel Malbon, as lies within the town of Cornville, bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning on Milburn line, in the centre of the lot No. 5 in the sixth range; thence Northerly at right angles with said Milburn line, to the North line of said lot; thence Easterly on said North line to the road leading to Haskell's Corner, so called, to the East Ridge in Cornville; thence south fifty rods; thence East one mile; thence south fifty rods to said Milburn line, together with the polls thereon, be, and the same is hereby set off from the town of Cornville in the County of Somerset, and annexed to the town of Milburn in said County: *Provided however,* That the said Malbon shall be held to pay all taxes assessed upon him in said town of Cornville prior to the passing of this Act.

What part of farm of said Malbon is set off.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. *Be it further enacted,* That the dividing line between the towns of Cornville and Milburn, as established by this Act, shall be, and constitute the dividing line between said towns, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
