Chapter 3.

Resolve in favor of the Penobscot Indians.

Approved January 27, 1831.

Resolved, That there be allowed out of the Treasury of the State, fifty dollars to John Neptune and Joseph Soc Basin, to defray the expenses of their journey to the seat of Government, respecting the affairs of their tribe; and that the Governor, with the advice of Council, be, and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 4.

Resolve for selling Timber on the Indian Townships.

Approved February 1, 1831.

Resolved, That the Agent of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians be, and hereby is authorized to sell to Ira Fish, so much timber on either or both of the Mattawamkeag Townships so called, as he may need for building a bridge over the Mattawamkeag River on the United States Military Road.

IN SENATE, January 28, 1831.

The Joint Standing Committee on the State Prison to whom was referred the account of the Warden of the State Prison for the current year, have attended to that duty and REPORT:

That by the provisions of an Act which passed March 16th, 1830, the Inspectors of the State Prison are required among other duties, to audit, correct, and settle all accounts with the Warden of the State Prison and to transmit the same to the Governor and Council to be laid before the Legislature—this account settled by the Inspectors has been presented, and it appears by said account that there is due Joel Miller, Warden of the State Prison, the sum of six thousand nine hundred and eighty seven dollars and ninety nine cents.
