Chapter 12.

Resolve in aid of the Alfred Academy.

Approved February 5, 1831.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the Treasury of the State to the Treasurer of the Trustees of the Alfred Academy, the sum of three hundred dollars; and the Governor, with advice of Council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 13.

Resolve authorizing a special Term of the Supreme Judicial Court in the County of Somerset.

Approved February 16, 1831.

Resolved, That a special Term of the Supreme Judicial Court, shall and may be holden by any one of the Justices thereof at Norridgewock, within and for the County of Somerset, on the fourth Tuesday of March next, if the same shall be deemed necessary, and expedient by any one of the Justices of said Court. And the said Justice, attending and holding said Court, shall have cognizance of all matters and things whatsoever, and shall proceed to the hearing and decision of all such causes and issues, as may have been heretofore entered, and are now pending in said Court, and give judgment and award execution in the same manner he might at any regular term of said Court as established by law. And any person aggrieved by any opinion direction or judgment of said Justice, may allege exceptions to the same in the same way he might at any regular established term of said Court. And the said Justice, so holding said Court, may order and direct the attendance of two traverse Juries at the Court to be holden as aforesaid.

Chapter 14.

Resolve to enable the Penobscot Indians to sell Pine Island in Penobscot River.

Approved February 19, 1831.

Resolved, That the Penobscot Indians, with the advice and approval of the Indian Agent, be, and hereby are authorized to sell and convey to Penly Haines all their right, title and
