eight hundred and twenty-four, to the said Samuel Brewer, his heirs or assigns, and the said deed or deeds so made, and executed shall give to, and vest in the said Brewer as good and perfect title to said tract of land, and its appurtenances, as if the said McCobb had given and executed a deed thereof to the said Brewer, in his life-time.

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### Chapter 17.

Resolve in favor of the Passamaquoddy Indians, and providing for the support of Governor Francis Joseph.

Approved February 24, 1831.

*Resolved,* That the Agent for the Passamaquoddy Indians, appointed by the authority of this State, be authorized, and it is hereby made his duty, to collect or cause to be collected all moneys due on judgments recovered, or which may hereafter be recovered, against trespassers who have, or may cut timber on lands belonging to said Indians; and that out of the moneys which shall be so collected, he shall expend two hundred dollars, annually, in the purchase and distribution of provisions to said Indians.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the Treasury of this State, annually, to Governor Francis Joseph, in consideration of his services during the revolutionary war, one hundred dollars, in quarter yearly payments, and until otherwise provided; commencing from the first day of October last.

*Resolved,* That the sum of seventy-five dollars be allowed, and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Deacon Sockbason, Special Agent for the Passamaquoddy Indians, to defray the expenses of said Agent, in travelling to and from the seat of Government on the business of said Indians; and the Governor with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasury for the same.

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### Chapter 18.

Resolve in favor of Nathaniel Haskell.

Approved February 25, 1831.

*Resolved,* That for reasons set forth in said Haskell's petition, the Land Agent be, and is hereby authorized and required, to convey by deed, for and in behalf of the State of

Maine, to Nathaniel Haskell, his heirs or assigns, three hundred acres of land, to be selected by said Haskell within one year from the passing of this Resolve, from any township of land belonging to the State of Maine, which is surveyed into lots. And should a re-survey be necessary, it shall be made at the expense of the said Haskell, under the direction of the Land Agent, *Provided*, This Resolve shall not interfere with, or delay the sale of any of the lands of the State, before notice in writing to the Land Agent of the lots selected, and *Provided further*, That said Haskell, shall not select any lot which is in the actual possession of any person.

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### Chapter 19.

Resolve in favor of Joshua Carpenter.

Approved February 25, 1831.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of this State, to Joshua Carpenter forty seven dollars in full for his services as Agent for making the Mattanawcook road, and for time and expenses in attending to the settlement of the accounts of his Agency; and the Governor with advice and consent of Council, is authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

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### Chapter 20.

Resolve in favor of Elias Thomas.

Approved February 25, 1831.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed Elias Thomas late Treasurer, the sum of one hundred and ninety four dollars and sixty three cents; the amount expended by him for fuel and lights, for the use of the State. And the Governor, with the advice of Council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for that sum.
