**Chapter 34.****Resolve in favor of Jane Hill.**

Approved March 12, 1831.

For the reasons set forth in the petition of Jane Hill, representing that her husband Henry Hill, late of Paris, in the County of Oxford, deceased, died seized and possessed of certain real estate in said Paris, consisting of three parcels of land, containing fifty nine acres, valued at one hundred and eighty dollars—that said estate will escheat to this State, and that the same is necessary for the support of the said Jane Hill, she being aged and infirm ;

*Resolved*, That the State hereby relinquishes all claim to the following described parcels of land in Paris, in the County of Oxford, being the same whereof Henry Hill, late of said Paris, died seized ; the first parcel bounded as follows, viz. beginning at the South West corner of lot numbered Three, in the seventh range of lots in said town, in the centre of the road leading by said farm ; thence North seventy two degrees East thirty nine rods ; thence North nineteen degrees East one hundred and twenty three rods ; thence North eleven degrees West forty rods to the lot line ; thence South seventy two degrees West fifty eight rods ; thence South sixteen degrees East seventy rods ; thence South fifteen degrees West ten rods ; thence South eight degrees East twelve rods ; thence South thirty one degrees West twenty five rods ; thence South twenty five degrees West forty six rods to the first bound, containing thirty eight acres and forty seven rods. The second parcel bounded as follows—beginning on the lot line between the third and fourth lots in the seventh range, at a rock maple stump, fifty four rods from the South West corner between said lots ; thence on said lot line seventy two rods, to a beach tree marked | - | - | ; thence Northerly, parallel with the range line to the most barren part of the hill or ledge, known by the name of single pole ; thence on the barren part of said hill, far enough Westerly to run parallel with the range line until it strikes the first bound, containing twenty acres. The third parcel being one acre, in the North West corner of lot numbered two in the seventh range ; to the said Jane Hill, her heirs and assigns forever ; and she and they are hereby authorized to sell and convey the same for her and their own use and benefit : *Provided*, That this Resolve shall not be construed to prejudice the claims of the heirs at law to said estate, if any such should hereafter appear.
