Chapter 54.

Resolve respecting the dividing line between Gray and Windham.

Approved March 26, 1831.

On the petition of the Selectmen of the town of Gray, praying that a Committee may be appointed by the Legislature to establish the line between the towns of Gray and Windham ;

Resolved, That Horatio Southgate of Portland, John Perley of Bridgton and Uriah Holt of Norway, Esquires, be, and they are hereby appointed a Committee, at the expense of the town of Gray, to ascertain and determine the true dividing line between the towns of Gray and Windham, being first sworn to the faithful and impartial discharge of their trust, and giving seasonable notice to all parties concerned, of the time and place of their meeting ; and said Committee, or a major part of them, shall have the power to ascertain and determine the line aforesaid, and it shall be their duty to describe the same by course and distance ; to make, set and mention in their return, suitable marks and monuments, for the permanent establishment of said line ; and also to make triplicate returns of their doings in the premises, one of which shall be for the town of Gray, one for the town of Windham, and shall forthwith be recorded by the town clerks of said towns respectively ; and the other shall be delivered to the Secretary of State ; and the line so ascertained, determined, described, marked and returned shall be the dividing line between said towns.

Chapter 55.

Resolve in favor of Kennebunk Port.

Approved March 26, 1831.

Resolved, That the State Treasurer be and he hereby is authorized to allow and deduct from the State tax of the town of Kennebunk Port for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty the sum of three hundred dollars as a relief from an undue proportion of the State tax for said year.
