Chapter 61.

Resolve in favor of Nathaniel Davis.

Approved March 30, 1831.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid to Nathaniel Davis, the sum of fifty dollars, in full compensation for a horse killed at a Regimental Review, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, and the Governor, with advice of Council is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the Treasurer for the same.

Chapter 62.

Resolve authorizing the Land Agent of this State in conjunction with the Land Agent of Massachusetts, to make *winter* roads through Public Lands.

Approved March 30, 1831.

Resolved, That the Land Agent of this State in conjunction with the Land Agent of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts be, and hereby is authorized and empowered to survey, lay out and make a suitable winter road, or cause the same to be done from the mouth of Matawamkeag, a branch of Penobscot river, in a Northerly direction, so as to strike the Aroostook river, on, or near, the line dividing the sixth and seventh ranges of townships, and pay for such part of said road as passes over lands belonging to this State, from the proceeds of the sales of lands: *Provided*, it does not exceed the sum of fifteen hundred dollars.

Resolved, That said Agent in conjunction with the said Agent of said Commonwealth, be and hereby is also authorized, to survey, lay out and make, or cause to be made a winter road from the village in Houlton in a Westerly direction, to intersect the road, to the Aroostook river, at some point most convenient for travelling, and best for the interest of the State; and pay for such portion of said road as passes over the lands belonging to this State, from the proceeds of the sales of land: *Provided* it does not exceed the sum of five hundred dollars.
