Chapter 69.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary.

Approved March 30, 1831.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is granted to the Trustees of the Maine Wesleyan Seminary, the sum of two thousand dollars, to be paid as follows, one thousand dollars on the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one, and one thousand dollars on the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two; and the Governor, with advice of Council, is hereby authorized to draw his warrants on the Treasury for the same.

Roll No. 12, for 1831.

The Committee on Accounts having examined the several accounts referred to them, now ask leave to present the following REPORT; That there is now due to the persons hereinafter mentioned, the sums set to their names respectively, which when allowed and paid, will be in full discharge of said accounts, to the several dates therein named.

Chapter 70.

Resolve for the payment of Accounts against the State.

Approved March 30, 1831.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the Treasury of the State, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated to the several persons mentioned in Roll number twelve, the sums set against such persons' names respectively amounting in the whole to the sum of eleven thousand, four hundred, sixty eight dollars and sixty five cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they refer.
